

LOTS and HOTS



Procedure

Before viewing/listening

- 1. Tell your learners the topic of the spoken text. Invite them to work **in pairs** and to both write down the words/expressions/key vocabulary they think will come up in the text.
- 2. Tell them to compare their words with another partner and add to their list.

While viewing/listening

- 3. Have them listen to/watch the spoken text/video.
- 4. Ask them to share 2 (3) things that impressed them about what they have heard/seen with a partner.
- 5. In pairs, ask them to express the main idea of the spoken text/video.
- 6. Provide them with TRUE/FALSE statements or YES/NO or TWO-OPTION questions (depending on their level).
- 7. Have them listen to/watch the spoken text/video again. Tell them to answer the questions.

After viewing/listening

- 8. Have them check their answers with a partner.
- 9. Share/correct in the plenary.
- 10. Tell them to re-visit their initial word lists. Which of the expressions have they actually heard? Share.
- 11. End-of-lesson evaluation: Ask your learners to share with a partner 3 new things they have learnt from the video/spoken text.

Alternative

If the video/spoken text features speakers who express opinions, provide your learners with the following scale and speaker letters.

Scale:	l strongly disagree					I'm not sure			I strongly agree		
	0	1	2	3	4	5	6	7	8	9	10

<u>Speaker letters/names</u> A(/Mr Brown) B

2. Stop the video/recording after the opinion statements, and have your learners write 1-10 against each letter, according to their opinion of what they have heard.

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
