Procedure

- 1. Write 10-15 topic-related expressions on the blackboard (e.g. in white chalk).
- 2. Ask your learners to come to the board and, to each word/expression, add a definition, an English synonym, or a translation. They use a different colour of chalk.
- 3. Tell them that each person can only add ONE definition, synonym, or translation.
- 4. Tell them to sit down.
- 5. Together add/correct.
- 6. Tell them "to sit on their pens", i.e. they are not allowed to take notes at this stage.
- 7. Ask them to memorise the expressions for 2 minutes.
- 8. Tell them to close their eyes.
- 9. Erase some definitions, synonyms, translations. Add a line where you erased a word.
- 10. Tell them to open their eyes, come to the board, and fill in the missing expressions. Tell them that each person can only add ONE definition, synonym, translation.
- 11. Repeat step 5.
- 12. Repeat steps 7-8.
- 13. Erase some of the original (English) topic-related expressions you wrote on the board.
- 14. Repeat steps 10 and 5.
- 15. Tell them to copy down all the expressions.
- 16. Then tell them to highlight 5-7 expressions in their notes that they REALLY want to remember.
- 17. Then tell them to tick their 2 absolutely favourite expressions.
- 18. Ask them to write a sentence with each of their two favourite expressions.

Optional

Revise some of these words at the beginning of the next lessons (see review/revision chapter).
